

#### **ANZAC Spirit at Ironbark Ridge**

During the holidays on 25<sup>th</sup> April several of our Student Leaders represented us by laying a wreath at the ANZAC Day Dawn Service held in Kellyville. They were extremely proud and respectful ambassadors for Ironbark Ridge Public School.

On Tuesday we stopped and assembled as a school to remember and honour all of the fallen service men and women - particularly from Australia and New Zealand - heroes of the many unfortunate conflicts around the world over the past century. Our guest speaker, Lieutenant Colonel Liz Anderson, spoke to our students about the ANZAC Spirit and how we can all strive to embody some of these qualities ourselves; virtues such as courage, endurance, initiative, discipline and mateship.



The Ironbark Ridge school spirit is aligned with these honourable traits through our motto: Strength – Respect – Excellence, and also via the 12 Successful Learner Habits we teach and develop in every learner every year. Every fortnight we meet as a whole school before lunchtime on Tuesdays in a virtual/video assembly we call our School Spirit Meeting. During these meetings this term we will be following this thinking to develop in our students ideas for how they can show mateship, develop discipline, use initiative and be strong with endurance and courage.

#### Successful Learner Habit: Thinking Monitor



One of the key habits developed by successful learners is the ability to monitor our mindsets and thinking patterns.in classrooms we give special responsibility to students for specific tasks and jobs... to develop responsibility. These students might be referred to as the *Computer monitor* – who puts the laptops all on charge so they are ready for use, or the *Lunch-tub monitor* – who makes sure the large tub is out in the playground for students to place their drink bottles and lunch boxes in after they eat. A Thinking-Monitor must always be responsible for their own thinking!

This examination is the final step in a highly-competitive application process for enrolment at one of the *selective* Public high schools across NSW. The exam is extremely difficult and certainly not for everyone, nor does it signify or guarantee any future success for a learner – it is simply one of many pathways students can travel along their schooling journey. Many of our local area Public high school students go on from Ironbark Ridge to score extremely high HSC results on par with their selective high school peers. #### **DEPUTY PRINCIPALS' REPORT**

#### **Welcome Back**

We hope everyone had an enjoyable break and found the time to rest and recharge their batteries, ready for a busy term of inspired teaching and learning at Ironbark Ridge. The Ironbark community warmly welcome our new students and their families to our school. We hope that you are all settling well and beginning to form strong connections.

To stay well-informed of the many exciting activities and events that our learning community has planned throughout the term, it is important to check our communication channels for details and any updates regularly. To ensure effective communication with our parents and carers, we have several channels available, including our fortnightly newsletter, Facebook posts, School Bytes portal feeds, school emails, electronic signage and class Seesaw messages and posts.

#### **School Development Day**

Last Monday, teachers in all Department of Education schools across NSW spent the day engaged in quality professional learning dedicated to curriculum implementation. As a school, we spent the first half of the day further exploring the teaching and learning cycle to support the planning of spelling in English and place value in mathematics, guided by syllabus outcomes and content in the English and Mathematics K-10 syllabus documents.

During the afternoon session, teachers had the opportunity to select from a menu of four professional learning courses to support the teaching and learning in their classroom. These professional learning opportunities included:

- Supporting students with disability in the curriculum
- Assessing and monitoring writing through the curriculum
- English 3-6: Exploring effective pedagogical approaches
- Curriculum planning for every student EAL/D (English as an Additional Language or Dialect) education

#### Sports in School Australia (SiSA)

During Term 2, students in Years 3-6 have the opportunity to participate in the Sports In Schools Australia (SiSA) Athletics Program. This program aims to give students the opportunity to learn and practise the skills of each track and field event in preparation for our school athletics carnival later this term. It teaches children the proper technique, safety rules and regulations of each skill in order to maximise their full potential. Many of the stage PDHPE outcomes are addressed throughout this program. Students will participate in a 40 minute session each Monday starting next week, Week 2. The athletics program will run for eight weeks across the term. Students are required to wear their sports uniform each Monday. Please remember that parent/caregiver permission and payment for this activity are due **Friday**, **10th May**.

#### Walk Safely to School Day

Walk Safely to School Day (WSTSD) is on **Friday**, **10th May**. It is an annual national event where all primary school children across Australia are encouraged to walk and commute safely to school. It is a community event that aims to promote road safety, health, transport and the environmental benefits that regular walking (especially to and from school) can provide for the long term wellbeing of our children. #### **Winter Uniform Changeover**

We officially move into our winter uniform on **Monday**, **13th May**. However, we would ask that the weather forecast be taken into consideration when dressing your child each day. Remember also that the girl's culottes are part of both the summer and winter uniforms, so they can continue to be worn all year. We encourage all students to take pride in their school. One way to display this is to wear the correct school uniform daily, including wearing school jackets when cold. Hats are a part of our school uniform throughout the year and students are expected to wear them at all times when outdoors.

#### Mother's Day Stall & Mother's Day Breakfast

Our P&C will run our annual Mother's Day stall on **Thursday**, **9th May**. Students will attend this stall at a designated time with their class teacher. Parents are asked to purchase their children's gift vouchers from the Spriggy Schools App. There will be no cash payments available on the day. The closing date for buying vouchers is Tuesday night, **7th May**. Students sitting the **Selective High School Placement Test** will have the opportunity to order their Mother's Day gift from a wide selection of presents on Wednesday and will be given these to take home on Friday.



All families are invited to join us for our annual Mother's Day breakfast on **Friday**, **10**<sup>th</sup> **May**. Food will be served from 7:30am to 8:30am at the canteen cola. Parents/carers are asked to RSVP using the online form in School Bytes. **Only one completed form is required per family**. Fathers are welcome to volunteer to assist throughout the morning and can indicate this on the online form. Please remember to bring along your smiles, as there will be many opportunities to capture the special moments throughout the morning.

#### **Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)**

This fortnight's PBL expectation is **Responsible:** Be at School on Time. Our teachers will continue to be at the gate each morning, reminding students who arrive after 9:00 a.m. of the importance of coming to school before the bell because every minute of school matters. Students who arrive after 9:00am miss the vital start of the school day where organisation for the day is shared and lesson introductions commence.

We have posters visible at our school entry and in classrooms with Ridgy and his friend encouraging us to be on time. When we enter the school gate after 9:00am, students will see the pathways and playground empty as the rest of the school is in their classrooms getting ready for the day's learning.

#### **Uniform Requirements**

#### Canberra Camp

In Week 11 last term our Year 6 students were able to experience an educational tour of our nation's capital, Canberra. Students were given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage, and democracy. The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government contributed funding of \$30.00 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate was paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.


