Dear Kindy Mum and Dad,



I would like to extend a very big and warm welcome to the new students and parents of Ironbark Ridge Public School (IRPS) from your school's P&C

Association.

Starting kindergarten is a very exciting time for you and your child ... it can also be daunting and confusing.

I am here to let you know that at IRPS you are not alone. As parents of our school and members of our P&C, we understand what it is like on that first day of kindergarten. Our hope is to make your introduction to our school as easy and special as possible for you and your little ones.

I have put together some information in this booklet that will help you settle in during your first few weeks of school.

The Ironbark Ridge P&C Association is a group of like minded parents who work towards growing our student, teacher and parent relationships by providing additional resources and support to ensure all children have every opportunity to excel. This is done through community events and operating various services in the school. The P&C Association proudly participates in many activities throughout our school.

All parents are welcomed and encouraged to join the P&C during their time with IRPS. Our P&C meets once a term in the school library at 7:00pm on a Wednesday in week 4 (or via online virtual meetings) and we openly invite you to join us. Come along and participate or just listen to updates from the School's Principal, teachers, and other parents. It is also a good way of meeting other families in our school.

We are a very fortunate school, with very successful fundraising programs initiated and managed by fabulous volunteer parents that make it possible for us to provide the school and teachers with additional resources and special wish list items.

A levy was introduced to enable the P&C to continue to provide resources to the school, while focusing on community events rather than fundraising. Although the levy is voluntary, we ask for your support. The P&C Levy is currently \$30 each for the 1st and 2nd Children, 3rd Child \$15.00 and 4th Child \$0. The Levy will be included in the Term 2 account you will receive from the school.

Many programs and resources have been made possible because of the school's P&C Association since the school's opening in 2005. The P&C has funded a number of resources over the years including the hall fans, stage curtains, library furniture, wireless network throughout the school, smart-boards in every classroom, air conditioning, upgrades to playground and sporting areas, purchase of musical equipment, new signage for the school, Words Their Way program, sport uniforms, subscription to World Book Encyclopedia and a student welfare program. Also recently the Electronic Sign Board and Concrete Stencilling throughout the school.

How can I find out what is happening at the school?

The school produces a fortnightly newsletter with information about current and upcoming events and is a key source of information for staying informed.

For communication, IRPS uses School Bytes for Parents. This system is used along with Facebook to send messages to families. School Bytes also allows you to view and update absences, advise the school of future absences, update family contact details, book parent/teacher interviews and view your child's Semester reports. Permission notes for excursions and activities are now completed electronically. Please make sure that you provide permission through the School Bytes Portal and return payments before the due date, so your child doesn't miss out on the wide range of school activities that occur throughout the year. Specific event information is still available on the school website under "Notes".

At IRPS we also have 3 official Facebook pages – The School, Parent's page and IRPS P&C Association Facebook pages. We encourage you to use the Parent's Facebook pages to communicate with other parents about school related matters and to find out about what's been happening at the school or upcoming events. Please register with each of these pages to know what's going on.

The School also offers KT OOSH after and before school care. This is held onsite, and hours of operation are as follows: Before School Care 6:45am – 8:30am, After School Care 3:00pm – 6:00pm, Vacation Care 7:00am – 6:00pm. Finally, the School operates the canteen, which is managed by Doris Cull, and relies on parent & grandparent volunteers to help run it. The Canteen is open every day for recess and lunch. Ironbark Ridge Uniform Shops

The Uniform Shop operates within the School's Uniform Policy and aims to offer a service to the students and parents of the school by providing them with an opportunity to purchase uniforms (summer & winter) and accessories in one place.

Our function as an efficient business is to offer a consistent service and quality products to the school community. The Uniform Shop is run by the Ironbark Ridge P&C Association and staffed by VOLUNTEER parents. Excess funds raised by the Uniform Shop (outside of running costs) are used by the P&C Association for the benefit of the school.

The Uniform Shops preferred payment method is credit card/eftpos. You may purchase in person or our online store. Sizing guides are available online also to make your sizing selection easier. In this booklet you will find our basic uniform recommendations, starter pack info and online store details.

You will be notified via SMS when your order is ready for collection at the Uniform Shop (during our trading hours). Alternatively orders can be left in the school office to be collected during school opening hours or If you have older siblings at the school, orders can be send to their classroom. Please leave 'office collection' or the child's name and class details in the notes section of the order.

We ask parents to be mindful of large packages and your child's ability to carry them.

Exchanges are provided within 3 months of purchase date. Items need to be unworn/'as sold' condition with any tags attached.

There is no exchange on hats, socks, stockings or secondhand items. This can be done at the uniform shop or items can be left with the office staff providing your contact details, receipt number and a note stating what you would like exchanged.
