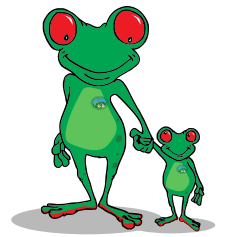

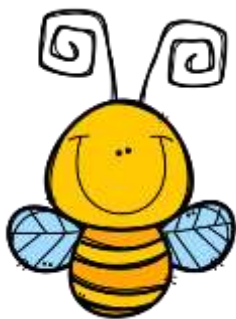

## KINDY CAPERS

It's hard to believe that Term 1 is over. We hope that all Kindy students and families have enjoyed the start to Kindergarten as much as we have. After the holidays, students will wear winter school uniform. Uniform items may be purchased from the school uniform shop adjacent to the office. Please ensure that all uniform items are clearly marked with student names and classes.

Mornings will soon be cool and it's important that lost items of clothing be easily identified and returned to keep students warm.

The Easter Hat Parade was a great day and the children have worked very hard on their hats and they thoroughly enjoyed displaying them for everyone to admire.

Next term Kindy homework will commence In Week 2. Each week students will receive home readers and homework. They will be handed out on Friday each week and will be returned the following Thursday. This allows time over the weekend if your week nights are busy with extra-curricular activities like sport and dance. It is important that homework is handed in on the Thursday to



allow teachers sufficient time to mark the work, allocate readers and send the next set of homework home as teachers have professional learning sessions in the afternoons after school. If you have not already done so, please send along an **A4 lined exercise book** that is covered with your child's name clearly marked on the front, we will supply a plastic document folder for the homework and reader. It is very much appreciated if an A4 size book and no other size book or different media are sent along. New sight word lists will also be sent home next term. Again do a few words at a time to ensure they are learning them well. Reading Eggs will commence in Term 2, logins and passwords were sent out yesterday. If you did not receive your password and login details please check your child's bag before you contact the teacher.

The Cross Country has been postponed due to the wet weather and ground closures. Dates for this event will be sent out as soon as we confirm a new date.

In Term 2 parent or carers will be or have been asked to help out with classroom programs. All helpers will need to complete working with children documentation as well as confidentiality agreements and return them to the office with 100 points of identification. Confidentiality is essential and it is very important that volunteers adhere to the school's policies. If you are interested in volunteering in your child's classroom please let your class teacher know. They will let you know if or when visits would be required. Unfortunately due to WH&S regulations, small children and babies are not allowed in the classroom during your volunteering time under any circumstances.

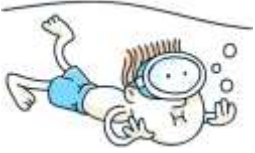
