PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Today's Year 6 Fun Day was a roaring success! Our students in Years 5 to Kindy had a great time playing, competing, eating and making... and throwing wet sponges at me! Congratulations to our Year 6 students for their organisation and leadership skills. Thanks also to their teachers and Mr Ian for working so hard in the lead-up to the Fun Day.



Book characters

Last Wednesday's Book Character Parade and Grandparents Day was a wonderful event, supported hugely by you, our community. Seeing and hearing stories about the shared reading going on in classrooms was really encouraging. I hope you use opportunities like this each year to spend time yourself modelling good reading habits. Maybe consider the idea of an evening routine for one night each week where a good book and a cosy seat replace the lure of the TV!

Learning... a second language

By now our Ironbark Ridge China Tour 2018 group of 20 students will be in Beijing, confronted by the stark reality that everyone around us speaks a different language!

At Ironbark Ridge we believe strongly in the benefits to our students of learning a second language. There is much research and evidence to support this view. One quickly *googled* newspaper article lists 'seven cognitive advantages' that bilingualism offers the learner.

For us at Ironbark Ridge, we want to see our students taking learning risks and developing a range of strategies for when they *don't know*. Learning a second language, like Mandarin Chinese, can provide real opportunities for our students to climb down into the *learning pit* and practice these *effective learner qualities*.

SBS (the TV channel) is currently running a competition for students who speak or learn a second language. See later in the newsletter for details from Ms Przyrembel, our language lead-teacher, about this fun and creative opportunity.

Science & Technology

In 2019 we will welcome the introduction of a new and improved Science and Technology K-10 syllabus, developed in NSW to match the Australian national curriculum. At Ironbark Ridge we have an enthusiastic and knowledgeable team of teachers who will oversee this change. It's a wonderful opportunity for us to examine our current practices and impact on student growth in scientific skills K-6. We have made recent additions to

our learning resources from Telstra (thanks for the coding kits we won this year ⁽³⁾) and from the NSW Dept. of Education through the *STEMShare* program (Stage 3 will have a lot of fun in Term 4 with these kits), and we are making further purchases using your 'Technology Levy' contributions this year. Our Year 6 students have recently completed an online assessment of their Scientific knowledge and skills called the VALID test, and results from this will be used to inform our whole-school decisions about Science and Technology learning K-6.

NAPLAN

Parents of Year 3 and Year 5 students will this week have received the envelope with their results. Our school completed the NAPLAN in 2018 on paper, a point worth noting given the media discussion about comparisons between paper and online versions of the test. Please read and consider your child's results in light of the fact that NAPLAN provides only one measurement, on one day. Your child's teacher is far more able to give you a reliable picture of their academic, social and physical growth and progress against the curriculum benchmarks. In the brief time that school staff have had online access to the whole-school picture from 2018 NAPLAN, we are very pleased with ongoing growth and achievement in many areas. Of particular note is the improved performance of our students as a whole in the area of Spelling... a success we attribute to the learning program you all helped us to implement over the past three years. I'll discuss our school performance in more detail early next term once we've had more opportunity to 'digest' it all ©



Regular Attendance and Punctuality

Daily school attendance is important for all children to succeed in education. Students are expected to arrive at school by 9am to maximise learning and minimise disruption to classes. Attendance rolls are marked daily at this time. Student supervision in the school playground commences at 8:30am, we do not encourage students to arrive before this time. If your child is going to be absent for any reason, a written note to the school is required. All students need to be signed into the office by an adult if they are late to school. The school day finishes at 3pm and students are dismissed. If you are unable to collect your child at 3pm, a phone call to the school is required to inform the administration

staff of the arrangements you have made for your child. Teachers are required to be at meetings and professional learning events from 3pm and are not available for after school supervision. At Ironbark Ridge PS we are fortunate to have a before and after school care program (KTOOSH) for those families who need to have care for their children outside of school hours. We encourage those families who are experiencing difficulty in collecting their children at 3pm to make arrangements with KTOOSH, to cater for the unexpected traffic that can occur near the school. 
