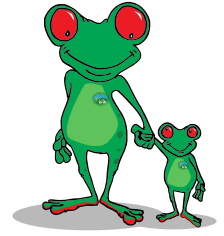

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Personal Growth: Student Reports

Semester 2 learning progress reports are currently being 'built' by our wonderful team of teachers. The many hours spent designing specific assessment tasks to provide students with the opportunity to demonstrate their skills and understanding turn now into the job of analysing, discussing in teams to ensure consistency of judgement, then representing each student's level of achievement against the standard curriculum 'benchmarks'. In reports you will see lists of behaviours and skills under subject headings. Each has a tick reporting that the student has 'Achieved' this level of skill/understanding, or is either 'Working towards' it, or 'Working Beyond' that level. All very well... particularly if your child is achieving at a level approximately average for their age. Some students, however, see a report with *all* 'Working towards' ticks. What level of skill or understanding CAN this student perform at? We certainly know what they can't do, but that is far from helpful! Similarly, others are 'working beyond' almost every single benchmark... and again we could ask "So what exactly CAN they do?"

Much work needs to be done in this space for us as a school, and indeed for the entire primary education and curriculum sector. Our current report format just can't cope with such an idea as reporting on a student's 'personal growth' rather than just on 'achievement against benchmarks'. A combination would be worth investigating!

In the meantime, please remember the enormous effort our Ironbark Ridge teachers invest in crafting each student's comment, for it is in these descriptive paragraphs that they attempt to highlight some of the specific areas of growth individual students have made in 2019, and the next steps they will need to make and challenges to overcome on their **personal growth** learning journey into 2020.

In short, it is far more healthy for Ironbark Ridge students to compare themselves against who they were last week and at the start of 2019, rather than comparing themselves with what other students can do today...

Collaboration (a Successful Learner Habit)

The ability to work effectively as a member of a team is crucial in almost every facet of our modern lives. When learning in a classroom environment, this skill can be of huge benefit. A collaborative learner is open to new ideas and the chance to learn from others. They take the attitude that everyone else might know something that they don't... so they listen to others!

A successful learner actively contributes their own thoughts, knowledge, opinions and skills to the team in a methodical, sensitive and constructive manner, encouraging others and facilitating sharing to maximise collective wisdom. The collective ideas of a group will almost always trump the singular idea of an individual. Successful learners seek the best outcome or solution for their group to adopt through discussion and the reaching of consensus. They are accountable, and fulfil their own role within the group. An extremely high level

learner will even be aware of, and suppress their own agendas, allowing the truth and best ideas to emerge. Trusting and building respect through integrity and hard work, successful learners can make a group, team or organisation far more than the sum of the individuals within it. These sorts of organisations take on an identity and life of their own! Acknowledging and using each others' strengths is the foundation for successful collaboration.

Students will be developing their collaborative skills in class over the next fortnight.

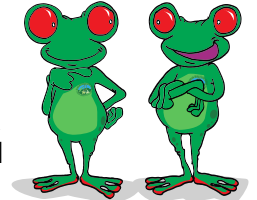
Halloween Colouring Champs

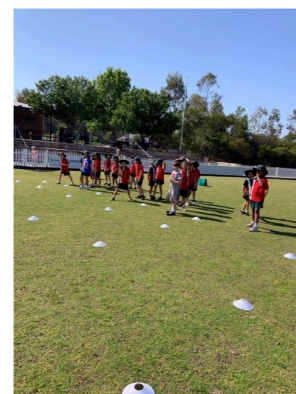

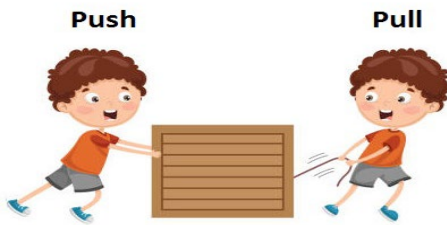
ES1 Teachers

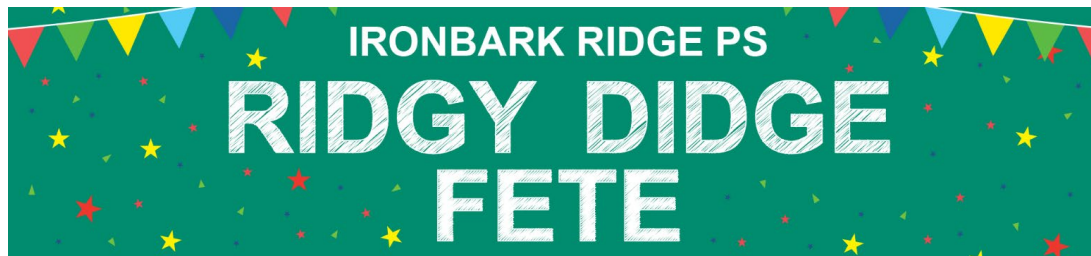
