PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

This past fortnight has felt like a re-start to the whole year! Routines and expectations are so important to us all in operating at our best, and it is comforting to begin re-establishing these norms. The word 'Habits' has gained some negative connotation over time, most commonly used when referring to our BAD habits. It is timely to note that a *habit* is simply a behaviour we have practised over and over to the point of becoming almost automatic. If you take the time to ponder, you will discover that your daily and weekly life is composed of many good, helpful, empowering habits. One view might suggest habits can be restricting and tyrannical, however I prefer to see them as ultimately freeing! When my mind is released to do what it does best – to think creatively, to imagine new and better solutions, to dream up what could be in the future and make plans to get there – I have a better chance of growing to become *Strong*, *Respectful*, and *Excellent*!

We look forward to our students continuing to build their House and school spirit over these next weeks and months as we can all now gather in larger groups. Our current students from each class in the SRC have not had much chance to develop skills and enjoy their special role so they will continue until the end of Term 3. Afternoon pickup changes

Huge thanks for the way you have all supported our controlled release of students at the gates of our school over the past three weeks. From next Monday, 15th June, we will make the next step in our afternoon student releases, mainly in response to the large amount of lost learning time the K-Yr1 early finish has resulted in. Please read the Deputy Principals' report on this topic closely. Morning drop-offs will remain constant for some time though; we are continuing to ask that students are farewelled at the front gate. The independence and calmness of our youngest students has really pleased all of their teachers, who have been able to get learning started with keen, settled students extremely quickly – an excellent gain given the disruption of the past Term. Minimising the time non-essential adults spend in the Safe Zone of our school grounds remains the target, keeping all of our students safe.

At the start of each year we ask for a contribution from each family towards the ongoing maintenance and cyclical replacement of our classroom digital devices. Without these additional funds our annual school budget would not allow us to equip each classroom so well. Many classes across our school are currently receiving new replacement laptops and iPads to keep students using reliable and up-to-date devices to support their learning activities. No doubt one of the major effects that will endure long after this pandemic is a change in our view of the world. As adults we tend to think we've seen it all; that we've got the world worked out! Random acts of kindness seem to come naturally for people in our community, and we are extremely lucky to be a part of such a great country and nation. Foods and eating at school

Along with Teachers' continuing their close supervision of hand-washing and other personal hygiene across our school, eating has always been another carefully monitored activity. Some of our students have allergies and intolerances to certain foods and as a result we do request that you are mindful of what you send your own children to school with in their lunch boxes, however we do not support *restrictions*. It is important for ALL of our students to learn about all aspects of eating, and it would be unhelpful to promote the idea that foods such as nuts, dairy, eggs or mango are not ever part of our school environment. That would create a false sense of security. Our students with allergies, with their supportive and responsible families, remain alert and careful in their eating habits. Classroom Teachers at Ironbark Ridge care for and know the needs of every individual in their class. Admin office, non-teaching and canteen staff support this work and are also aware of individual students and their health care plans. Students are not allowed to share food at any time with friends for this obvious reason. We have detailed and effective school procedures to support the safety of all of our Ironbarkers.

At the end of this newsletter I've attached a 2-page 'Guide for parents and carers' outlining the latest updates to procedures in NSW primary schools returning to normal. Please have a read.

I can't resist finishing by saying how good it is to see footy back on the TV! It's not long now either before we can return our young sportspeople to the field for fun and learning, skill and teamwork development, fitness and friendship.

Opportunity Class Test

The application process for Year 5 opportunity class placement for entry in 2021 is about to begin. Important dates in the application process are as follows:

- Tuesday 9 June 2020: Online applications opens
- Friday 26 June 2020: Online applications closes (Parents and carers must apply by the due date.)
- Wednesday 16 September 2020: Opportunity Class Placement Test

Return to Learning at School

Our students have shown themselves to be resilient, organised and persistent during these unprecedented times. They have embraced their return to school with enthusiasm and seized the opportunity in a positive manner. We'd like to acknowledge the strong commitment to the learning and wellbeing of all students demonstrated by our dedicated teachers and staff at IRPS. We'd also like to thank our parent community for their part in ensuring that the children have remained engaged with school and their learning.

Thank you also to parents for adhering to and respecting our drop off and pick up arrangements. However, from next **Monday 15th June**, we have decided to make changes to these arrangements, in order to try to minimise the disruption to teaching and learning in the afternoon sessions which has occurred over the last three weeks.

Morning Drop Off

We continue to ask that parents please drop off their children at either:

- Front Gate (Pick up area on Ironbark Ridge Road),
- Top gate on Withers Road, or
- Bottom gate on Caballo Street.

The playground will be supervised (as per usual) from 8.30am each school day. *We continue to ask that parents do not enter the school grounds in the mornings.* If you need to enter the school grounds, please proceed directly to the School Office. We appreciate your co-operation and understanding in this matter.

Afternoon Pick Up Arrangements - All children will be dismissed at 3pm.

- Parents of children in Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2 ONLY are invited to come onto the school grounds from **2.55pm** to meet their child in the pre-arranged pick up areas. All other parents are requested to remain off-site, to keep adults on school grounds to a minimum.
- Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2 students will now be dismissed at 3pm from the basketball court (Kindergarten) and E and G Block COLAs (Years 1 and 2).
- Parents of Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2 students are asked not to park and leave their car in the pickup area directly in front of the school. The car pick-up area will continue to be supervised by school staff to encourage a steady flow of traffic.
- Parents of K-2 students may use the car pick up area if they remain in their car; please ensure your child is aware of these arrangements so they know to take themselves out to the front gate.
- Students in Years 3-6 are asked to make their own way home in their usual way.

We thank you for your patience and understanding as we work to prioritise student safety and learning time.

Parent – Teacher Interviews

This year, teachers will conducting parent- teacher interviews via phone calls to parents, at pre-arranged times. These interviews are an opportunity to share their experiences of student learning during the *Learning From Home* period, their re-adjustment and return to school, and discuss strategies for growth moving forward into Semester 2. Most teachers will be holding their interviews during the week of **22nd-26th June**. **Our Sentral booking system will open in the Parent Portal at 5pm on Friday 12th June, and close at 5pm on Thursday 18th June**. *Please be aware that teachers will call the phone number of the parent making the booking, information which is stored on our systems*. If your number has recently changed, you must update it with the school office in order for our teachers to contact you. If you have any problems accessing the interview booking system, please contact the school.

Collaborative Practice

With our return to a certain level of 'normal' in our day to day practices here at school, our teachers are re-learning about their students and sharing best practice approaches to teaching and learning. They are spending time this week and next studying and comparing student work samples, ensuring we can report on and share information about student learning achievement with consistency.

Opportunity classes can provide intellectual stimulation by grouping together high potential and gifted students who may otherwise be isolated from a suitable peer group. Successful students will usually have to leave their current school to enrol in a school with an opportunity class for Years 5 and 6.

New for 2021 entry

A Year 5 virtual opportunity class has been established at Aurora College for students in rural and remote NSW. Further information is available at http://www.aurora.nsw.edu.au/

Testing and assessment

Applications for opportunity class placement are considered on the results of the Opportunity Class Placement Test. Students who wish to be considered for opportunity class placement will sit the Opportunity Class Placement Test on **Wednesday 16 September 2020**.

How to apply

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 5 opportunity class entry in 2021, you need to apply between **Tuesday 9 June 2020** and **Friday 26 June 2020**. You will need to access the online application at <u>https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-5</u>. You must **not** use the child's email address.

If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the High Performing Students Team for assistance after **9 June 2020**. Contact details can be found on the web site shown below.

You must submit only **ONE application** for each student.

Important – the school cannot apply on your behalf.

For kindergarten siblings of current students, please keep in mind that our catchment area changed significantly due to the opening of North Kellyville Public School last year. You may find that your address no longer falls into our catchment area or perhaps you have moved address since your older children commenced school. If your address is no longer within our catchment area, you will need to fill out a Non-Local Application which can also be found on our website under "About Our School", then "Enrolments". 

NATIONALLY CONSISTENT COLLECTION OF DATA

The data provided to the Australian Government by the NSW Department of Education and Communities is provided in such a way that it cannot be used to identify any individual student or school. Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines* (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

year of schooling

category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional

level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools

consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools

develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. 

This guide is for parents and carers

A guide to NSW school students returning to face-to-face learning

Information has been updated as at 11 June 2020, until further notice.



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In line with health advice, schools are operating full time, and many additional activities are now able to recommence

All schools have returned to full-time on-campus learning. With updated health advice and changes to state and national restrictions, schools are able to recommence the majority of school-based activities from either 15 June 2020 or the start of Term 3 (20 July 2020). Some activities are continuing to be considered.

The following principles underpin these guidelines:

- schools continue to be safe and operations are in line with Australian Health Protection Principal Committee (AHPPC) and NSW Health guidelines
- existing infection control protocols at schools, and new health and safety measures put in place will help maintain the health and safety of students and staff
- all activities permitted at school are safe and appropriate in a living with COVID-19 environment.

School students do not need to follow strict adult physical distancing guidelines, but should follow good hygiene practices like:

- regularly washing hands
- avoiding sharing drinks or food
- coughing or sneezing into your elbow, or a tissue which should be discarded immediately
- filling water bottles from bubblers rather than using the bubbler directly.



All students should be at school unless:

- they have a medical certificate which states that they are unable to return to school due to an ongoing medical condition and the expected timeframe
- they are currently unwell.



The majority of school-based activities can recommence, as long as the following measures are observed:

- all visitors and external to school providers must adhere to relevant hygiene, distancing and safety protocols
- principals may continue to restrict, limit or prohibit activities if they are seen as contrary to the current health advice
- external providers and visitors are required to demonstrate compliance with health and safety requirements including adhering to strict guidelines and completing relevant forms
- non-essential adults are still not permitted on school grounds or at school events – this includes parents/carers unless specifically approved by the principal.



Physical distancing of children in schools is not required under the Australian HPPC guidelines. Research has shown limited transmission risk associated with school children in the school environment. All adults must maintain physical distance from each other (1.5m) including teachers and support staff, and parents.

Schools should ensure school pick up and drop off arrangements enable parents to physically distance from one another and from staff.

School cleaning and hygiene supplies

Your school will continue to receive additional cleaning in line with the AHPPC guidelines and advice from NSW Health. Target areas include high-touch areas and other hard surfaces, door handles, lockers, light switches and handrails in stairways and movement areas. There will also be additional cleaning of toilets and bubblers and topping up of supplies like soap.

Your school has received supplies of soap, hand sanitiser, toilet paper, paper towels, disinfectant wipes and personal protective equipment. The school is able to order more as needed.

School activities return and timeline

Activities/site usage that can already take place:

- Use the school library
- Engage in non-contact sporting activities
- Canteens and uniform shops can open at principal's discretion
- Year 11 and 12 students only may attend classes/activities relating to subjects only available on other campuses is allowed



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- VET work placement for Year 12 students is able to proceed from 1 June 2020. School based apprenticeships and traineeships can recommence once the relevant workplaces are back in operation
- Trade Training Centres can operate on school sites.

Activities/site usage that can take place from Monday 15 June 2020

- School assemblies (limited to 15 minutes and no external visitors)
- Choirs and performing arts at school, with safety protocols in place
- Students may attend other schools for essential curriculum related reasons or placements (e.g. auditions or placement tests)
- Hydrotherapy pools can be used
- Incursions/external providers can provide activities that support delivery of curriculum (e.g. music tutors, sport skills development programs, science demonstrations, drama tutors, Healthy Harold).
- Community use activities used by students such as dance classes, and student sport skills development, outside of school hours with limited adult attendance)
- Day field trips to outdoor locations with no physical distancing requirements can take place
- Face to face TAFE attendance (see TAFE website for further information)
- School photos
- Department of Community and Justice services and programs.

Activities/site usage that can take place from beginning of Term 3

• All school sport and activities including competitions aligned with current health advice (including those activities run by external organisations)

- Inter-school student events and competitions (choirs, sport, debating, public speaking, performing arts, Selective Sports High School trials etc)
- SRE/SEE lessons
- Work experience for students
- VET work placements can proceed subject to the availability of placement and appropriate risk assessments. For any that can't proceed, please see <u>the NESA website</u>
- School based apprenticeships and traineeships can recommence once the relevant workplaces are back in operation
- P&C meetings with a strong preference for on-line where possible
- Parent/teacher meetings where these need to take place – strong preference for online where possible unless involving serious matters that require face to face discussion
- Community use activities involving general adult attendance (such as community markets).

Activities under consideration from Term 3

The following events will be reconsidered in Term 3. For now these events must remain on hold.

- School camps
- Excursions (other than field trips explained above)
- Parent attendance at assemblies and other school events (e.g. graduation ceremonies or student speech events)
- Parent volunteers e.g. parent reading helpers (note: canteen and uniform shop volunteers are permitted)
- Interstate excursions
- School based activities that involve large gathering of adults are not permitted at this time. These include parent/community gatherings such as parent functions, working bees, fundraisers, school BBQs, large parent information evenings, and large on-site cultural events. These large gatherings and the following activities will continue to be reviewed and assessed based on AHPPC and NSW Health advice and may be permitted at a later date.

Activities that are cancelled, delayed or not permitted

Certain large arts and sports events are cancelled or delayed because they require feeder activities and have long-lead time organisational arrangements. Please speak to your schools if you would like to know more.

International excursions are cancelled until further notice.



You will receive your child's semester 1 report before the end of August (Week 6, Term 3). This will be a simplified version of the report you normally receive. Schools are encouraged to discuss your child's progress with you before the written report is issued.

Responding to COVID-19 cases

There is a clear plan in place for schools to respond to any suspected or confirmed cases of COVID-19 in our schools. We are working closely with NSW Health and will communicate with parents if a situation arises. Find out more at the <u>response protocols page</u>.
