PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Our teachers at Ironbark Ridge are an amazing bunch! It is so inspiring to listen to their collegial discussions

about the lengths they go to when assessing the growth and achievement levels of each one of their students, readying themselves to write final *Student Progress Reports*. The extra time and effort that goes into this task during both Term 2 and Term 4 each year is quite extreme; just think about the time needed to craft comments and ensure all 'ticks' are in the right places... and times that by 30! There are so many positive and exciting stories of student growth I am hearing across all of our teaching teams – a positive way to finish what has been an *interesting* (nice way of putting it) year.

Student Progress Reports will be published to all student accounts in the Sentral Parent Portal and App on the last Friday of term – Friday 11th December.

Student Leadership

We are conducting interviews this coming Thursday, as the final stage in the selection process for our 2021 Student Leadership Team. The Year 5 students involved have already completed over a term's worth of training sessions, a written application, and the Collaborative Trials day. Selection based on demonstrated application, attitude and merit (rather than an election) is the Ironbark Way...

What Works Best... Attendance

Recent weeks have seen a somewhat disappointing downturn in student attendance across the school. While there are many educational solutions to maximising student growth each year, there is no bigger requirement than for students to be at school as much as possible. Many of our students have a 100% attendance rate for the year. Unless students are actually sick they should be in their classroom, learning. Please make 100% attendance your goal.

Successful Learner Habits: Courage and Empathy

(We are all Ironbarkers... We are all Learners.)

This fortnight our students have been developing more courage in the face of learning challenges, and also thinking about the feelings and needs of others – practising empathy. Learners show courage when they see difficult tasks as a chance for growth, and mistakes as an opportunity for learning. It takes a lot of courage to be the student who goes first or who answers even though they are not sure. Make "Have a go!" your motto and you will be making courage your Habit!


When working collaboratively, successful learners remember to hold back their own judgement and ideas to make sure they consider the perspective and thoughts of other group members. This is especially helpful in getting the best contributions of everyone and the result is usually a more powerful solution.

Check In!

Unfortunately NAPLAN was cancelled in 2020 due to the period of time spent *Learning from Home*, however we made sure that our Year 3 and Year 5 students were involved in a new online program: The Check In Assessment! Here's a graph from the results...



While we continue to evaluate our students', and ultimately our school's performance in a range of areas, the *Check-In* has let us know (as an example) that we need to focus some effort on learning about Measurement and Geometry! New Drive-through COVID-19 Clinic in Rouse Hill

Western Sydney Local Health District (WSLHD) has opened another drive-through testing clinic in Rouse Hill to provide more convenient access to COVID-19 testing. The clinic has been rapidly opened in response to traces of COVID-19 being detected as part of the state's sewage detection program in the Hills District. The latest drive-through clinic will be open 8am-4pm, seven days a week in The Fiddler car park, Rouse Hill 2155, accessed via Commercial Road. This clinic is wheelchair accessible, all ages are welcome, and no booking or GP referral is required. Anyone arriving for testing is advised to stay inside their vehicle at all times. Health staff follow strict infection control protocols for the safety of themselves and others.

KINDY CAPERS

As the term continues to race along Kindergarten students have been excited to have short visits to other classes within the school as they prepare to move on to Year 1 and make way for the Kindergarten 2021 arrivals. Opportunity Class Placement Test

We wish all students the best luck! The assessment will take place on **Wednesday 18th November at Ironbark Ridge PS**. Students need to make sure that they are at school before 9am. They will sit the assessment in the school hall. **Students MUST bring a printed copy of their 'Test authority' letter showing their application number.** They should also bring glasses, asthma inhaler and tissues, if required. They may bring a clear plastic water bottle – with no writing on it except for the brand name (to be stored under the seat to avoid spills). Any other medical equipment must be approved before the test. Students who have been granted disability provisions must bring any specially approved items. They **SHOULD NOT** bring pens, pencils, pencil cases, erasers, note paper or other material such as dictionaries or books. Equipment such as rulers, calculators, computers, mobile phones, computer watches, watches that calculate or beep or any device that calculates, photographs or communicates may not be taken into the test room. Pens will be provided for all students sitting the test.



NEW DRIVE-THROUGH COVID-19 CLINIC NOW OPEN IN ROUSE HILL

Western Sydney Local Health District (WSLHD) has today opened another drive-through testing clinic in Rouse Hill to provide more convenient access to COVID-19 testing.

The clinic has been rapidly opened in response to traces of COVID-19 being detected as part of the state's sewage detection program in the Hills District.

The latest drive-through clinic will be open 8am-4pm, seven days a week in The Fiddler car park, Rouse Hill 2155, accessed via Commercial Road.

This clinic is wheelchair accessible, all ages are welcome, and no booking or GP referral is required.

WSLHD chief executive Graeme Loy said the District is committed to providing safe, easy and convenient access to testing for all who need it.

"We are actively monitoring the situation in the Hills District and are encouraging anyone who lives, works, or is active in this area to get tested immediately if COVID-19 symptoms develop," Graeme said.

"We set up this clinic in under 24 hours to ensure we stay on top of COVID-19 in Western Sydney Local Health District. We continue to be ready to rapidly open other clinics if necessary."

"Thank you to the Hills Shire Council for their support with the opening of this latest clinic."

There are currently more than 23 testing clinics across Western Sydney Local Health District – find your nearest one here, and stay up to date with the latest COVID-19 news at the NSW Health website.

If you have any symptoms, it is important you self-isolate and arrange to get tested. Symptoms of COVID-19 include a sore throat, cough, high temperature or unexplained tiredness.

To help protect yourself against COVID-19, exercise the following precautions:

- Wash your hands regularly for at least 20 seconds with soap and water
- Avoid touching your face
- Maintain 1.5 metres physical distance from others in public
- Wear a face mask in public when physical distancing cannot be guaranteed

Anyone arriving for testing is advised to stay inside their vehicle at all times. Health staff follow strict infection control protocols for the safety of themselves and others.
