Reports

Student Progress Reports will today be uploaded and published to the Sentral for Parents portal, in the student details tab. You should receive a notification through the App.

Reports contain a wealth of detailed information about the progress each student is making, measured against expected skills and outcomes, across all six Key Learning Areas. Curriculum documents provide schools with description of specific markers and indicators of achievement to observe at all stages in conceptual development and learning progressions. These guidelines are then used by our Ironbark Ridge teaching teams to design assessment opportunities within learning programs that allow students to demonstrate the mastery of these skills has been *Achieved*, or perhaps a level of competency that is *Working Towards* mastery, and in some cases students may show enough evidence that they are *Working Beyond* this skill level and are in fact able to perform more complex and difficult skills.

Comments written by our teaching staff should then provide more 'colour' to the picture painted in this personalised report, and perhaps clarify any specific areas for future development and focus by each individual learner.

Ridgy the Frog is our school mascot, and the hero/protagonist in the metaphorical, arduous and infinite journey of learning and growth. No matter our stage in life, we have skills to learn and aspects of our self to grow and develop. 




