### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

### Celebrating learning...

This week we have acknowledged the year's growth and achievement of all of our learners at Celebration Day assemblies, with special guests such as our NSW Dept. of Education Director, local NSW Member of Parliament, Hills Shire Councillor, Lions Club and P&C representatives greatly enjoying presenting special awards. I reminded our learners that although only a few students can be brought up onto the stage to receive

an award, we are extremely proud of the growth EVERY learner at Ironbark Ridge has made in 2023. Almost every hand went up across our K-2 learners when I asked who had made a mistake in 2023 and had learnt from it to improve their performance - a sign they feel positive about this confronting part of the learning process. Learning is not easy, and can at times feel quite uncomfortable, but being Agents of Learning is the Ironbark Way!

### **Learning Progress Reports 2023**

On Tuesday next week (12/12) we will for the first time use the **School Bytes** platform to publish every one of our 880-ish student Learning Progress Reports. The reports are not produced on paper, but rather published to you as a pdf document stored securely in your child's learning profile, under the Documents tab, in the School Bytes App and Parent Portal. It appears you will need to scroll down to find the last report in



your child(ren)'s previous reports from the old online platform have been manually moved across by our fantastic admin staff so you have easy future reference with them all in the one place. For anyone departing the school, please ensure you download all reports and

documents from the School Bytes portal and save them into your own cloud or other digital storage to retain access after leaving Ironbark Ridge PS. However, if stuck next year, remember we are always happy to help as we have internal access to old documents long into the future for you ©

Following on from discussions we had with you at Learning Partnership meetings early in Term 3, our learners and their teachers have been hard at work trying to achieve each new learning goal during Semester 2, even setting new and more challenging ones along the way. As usual, learners are measured against our Syllabus expectations for each individual key concept, skill and subject content point. We use three separate scales:

- Effort and Application (a five-point scale),
- Overall Achievement (in each subject), and

specific Indicators of Learning (note the reversal of the previous arrangement of 'columns of ticks' with Working Beyond now to the left and Working Towards (ie. Not yet achieved) on the right.
 Learning Progress Reports are due to be visible in your parent portal documents from next Tuesday afternoon 12<sup>th</sup> December. You will receive a notification in the School Bytes communication feed to alert and remind you that evening.


Our team for 2023 has been amazing, demonstrating sensational integrity, collaborative skill, enthusiasm and commitment to lead the ongoing development of our positive and inspired school learning culture. Our 2023 Leadership Team has set the bar extremely high for next year's team to aspire to, and I'm sure the new team are up for the challenge.

### Goals for 2024

At Ironbark Ridge we have highlighted and developed the crucial idea that our learners are the main 'protagonist' or *Agent* in their *Learning Journey*. This has brought together several changes including the introduction of students setting specific and measurable Learning Goals in 2021, the addition of a Student Comment into their own Learning Progress Report from 2022, and Year 2 to Year 6 students included as central participants in the twice-yearly *Learning Partnership meetings* with yourselves and Teachers from 2023. Learner Agency will always be at the centre of *The Ironbark Way*. In 2024 we are focussing on the processes we use to involve students in authentic assessment of their learning progress and growth, along with further development of teachers' use of High Impact Assessment strategies.

### Successful Learner Habit – Empathy

In life and learning we are constantly in social situations with our peers and colleagues. Effective learners must develop empathy - the ability to understand and read the emotions, opinions and desires of others around them, described through the metaphor of walking in somebody else's **shoes**. This provides the learner with important information to support choices about their own behaviour in the interest of effective teamwork and collaboration; to create a more powerful team. Being sensitive to others' needs and acting to encourage, listen and understand helps to build positive relationships based on trust and respect. Ridgy the Frog also finds that in order to authentically listen to others in their group or class they sometimes have to block out their own opinions. iudgements. memories experiences, and ask "What does this mean to them?"



**Empathy** is different to sympathy, by the way, and means we can understand our friends and family while remaining able to help them and make good decisions about our own learning journey.

### **Daily Attendance**

Ridgy has been closely following student attendance over the past fortnight. This fortnight, Ridgy reports a dip in our attendance data. Last fortnight, we had **539 students out of our 882** attending school, greater than 90% of the time. This fortnight, Ridgy reports that we had a drop of 55 students. We had only **484 students out of our 882** students attending school greater than 90% of the time. Ridgy knows that we can do a lot better than this! Ridgy's message for this fortnight is below, and in addition, Ridgy would like us to know that our executive team are continually monitoring student late arrivals.



### **Positive Behaviour Learning (PBL)**

This fortnight's PBL expectation is **Responsibility**. Doing the right thing at the right time.

During this final week of term, students will focus on the following expectations:

- 1. Wear your hat in the playground at all times.
- 2. Be in the right place at the right time




