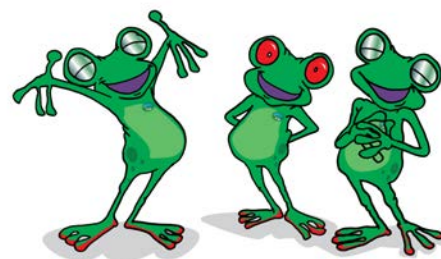

### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### Learning Progress Reports

By Wednesday next week you will receive a notification that a new report has been published to the SchoolBytes Portal and app. *Student Learning Progress Reports* are an opportunity to consider the growth already made, the learning skills, habits and attitudes displayed, and chance to set goals together in partnership for the second half of the year. It's crucial that even the youngest learners are a part of this process if they are to develop into *Agents of Learning* over their 7 years of primary school. To this aim, learners should have a chance to read and understand the report made on their progress. Teachers might begin this process in the classrooms before the end of the term, however your involvement at home over the coming holiday period is important – read and discuss the report together with your children individually!



#### Learning Progress Meetings

When we return from holidays, in Week 2 next term, we will be holding our usual start-of-Term 3 *Learning Progress Meetings*, with our Year 2 to Year 6 learners involved, telling us about their own reflections on their progress in class during Terms 1 and 2, and their learning goals and areas of focus for Semester Two. Kinder and Year One students are welcome to attend these meetings with the teacher and parents, however they are not required if you feel it more productive with just two adults in the room at this stage. An invitation to the online School Interviews booking system will be emailed out on the first day of Term 3, Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> July. Please get in early to book a time then that suits you.

#### Warrior

In our School Spirit meeting this week I spoke to our learners about the *Warrior* characteristic of Ridgy the Frog and many of our older Ironbark Ridge students – it's one of the words on our Ironbark Ridge Spirit Tree on the end of our Canteen COLA! A warrior is always fierce but fair, shows honesty and integrity, is humble and loyal, disciplined and optimistic. We want every Ironbark Ridge student to show the qualities of a Warrior in their learning – determined and focussed on growth and improvement on their learning journey.

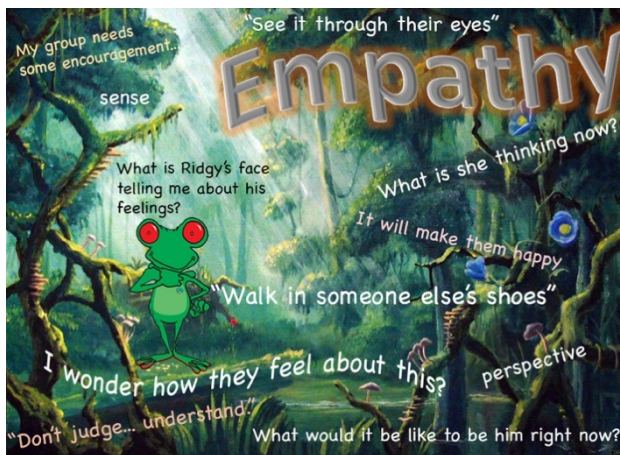


#### Successful Learner Habit: Empathy and Persistence

During these past two weeks across the school we have been discussing and practising our empathy as a *Successful Learner Habit*.

Learning rarely happens in a solitary situation while at school. Showing awareness of, and sensitivity to, the feelings and learning needs of others (empathy) in our teams and groups is an important *Habit* to develop as it ensures:

- each learner has an open mind to the possibility that their own currently held ideas might be lacking or incorrect (a growth mindset) – awareness of their own values, judgments, opinions, and prejudices.
- learners value the knowledge, opinion, and skills of all group members and encourage their contribution, increasing the power of the group’s collective wisdom and knowledge.
- learners are able to disagree politely and productively if necessary.
- the learner makes adjustments to their own behaviour to accommodate the needs of others in a group.



As empathetic learners, Ironbark Ridge students can give *effective* feedback to other students about their performance, matching the wording and emphasis, the ‘delivery’ of the feedback, to their peer’s perceived mindset and receptiveness at that moment. Empathy is crucial because poorly received feedback is essentially worthless to the learner receiving it (or resisting it 😊). Successful Learners develop their empathy for success in relationships and life in general!

### Winter grass

Unfortunately our school grass playing area remains particularly wet due to the recent rains and ongoing cold evenings. Although we’d love to have our students out running and playing on the grass it will take a few more days of sunshine before the area is safe for play. Some additional aeration and warmth during the holidays might help! Here’s hoping...

### Excellence... in Cricket

With weekly Friday morning winter interschool sports getting more regular (thanks to less rain) our teams have enjoyed early successes and a lot of fun trying. Avni (5B) is already looking forward to the summer season later in the year so she can continue to practice, develop and show her amazing skills in cricket. Avni had an outstanding summer season with her weekend club, playing under 14s as a ten-year old, being the second highest run-scorer and third highest wicket-taker for the team. ## Sports in Schools Australia (SiSA) Gymnastics Program Commencing: Monday 29th July (Term 3, Week 2)

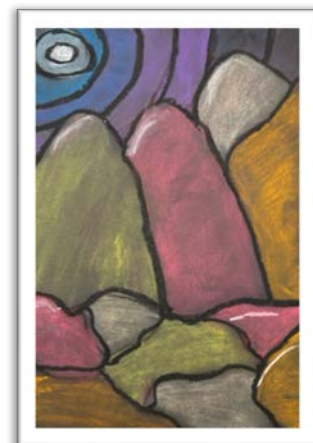
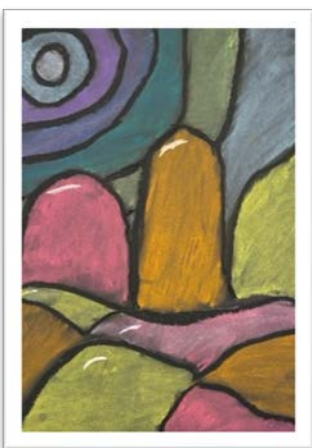

## Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)

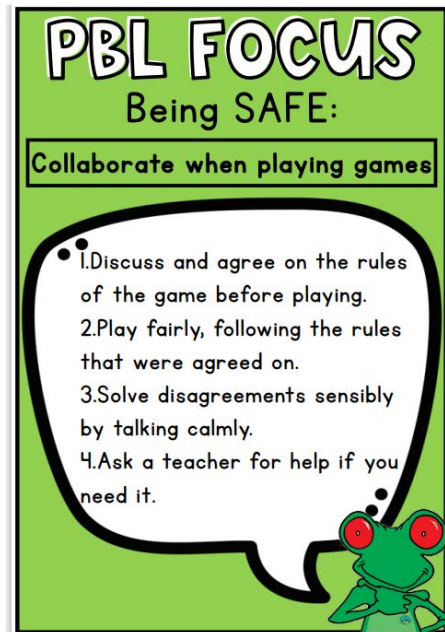
This fortnight's PBL focus is **SAFETY**: Collaborate when playing games. Over the next two weeks (Week 10, Term 2 and Week 1, Term 3), students will revise the following expectations during whole school meetings and in their classroom:

1. Discuss and agree on the rules of the game before playing.
2. Play fairly, following the rules that were agreed on.
3. Solve disagreements sensibly by talking calmly.
4. Ask a teacher for help if you need it.

Ridgy loves coming to school and challenging himself to learn in the classroom, but he also loves being with his friends in the playground. He knows that the best way to have fun and stay safe is to work with his friends to make sure that the game is a success.

Before starting a game, Ridgy and his friends talk about the rules that they will use when playing. They only start the game once they have agreed on the rules they will use and how they will play so that everyone has the same understanding.

Even though everyone agrees to follow the rules, sometimes Ridgy and his friends have disagreements. When they do, they try to solve the problem sensibly by calmly discussing the situation. If they can't solve the problem themselves, they know they can go to the teacher for help and the teacher will listen and help them find a solution. By doing these things, Ridgy and his friends help to make the playground a safe space for all Ironbarkers.

## DATES FOR THE DIARY

Upcoming events for Stage 2 include:

*Week 10* —

Students in Year 3 (specific classes are 3F, 3G, 3W and Year 3 students from 4/3B) will go to **The Rocks** on Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> July, and students from Year 4 (specific classes are Year 4 students from 4/3B, 4D, 4M, 4R and 4Z) will go to **The Rocks** on Friday 5<sup>th</sup> July.

Stage 2 **Public Speaking Competition** final round will be held on Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> July.

## History Excursion to The Rocks

Stage 2 students will be attending an excursion to The Rocks in Sydney in Term 2 Week 10, as part of their history unit this year. During the excursion, students will put themselves in the shoes of the European people who first set foot on Australia's shores and discover why these explorers travelled such great distances. Students will learn about the effects of British colonisation in Australia and discuss indigenous perspectives on European arrivals. They'll examine the timeline of our country's journey through time, from Aboriginal inhabitation to post-colonial Australia. The excursion is sure to deepen student understanding and empathy for the struggles, challenges and triumphs that have made Sydney the great city it is today, including those of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples; early traders, explorers and settlers, first fleters and their descendants. We are looking forward to all of Stage 2 gaining a new appreciation for the depth of experiences and perspectives that have made up our past.

Please note, students are to arrive at school by 8.30am for a prompt departure. They can wear either their sports or full school uniform. In a small bag, they are to bring their school hat and jacket, their recess, lunch and a water bottle. Students will not be able to purchase food and no canteen is available on the day.

## Borrowing from our Library

Just a reminder that each week students can borrow books from the library. It is a wonderful opportunity for children to choose their own reading material. Please continue to encourage your child to borrow and return their library books each week. It is essential that students use a library bag to borrow books from the school library.
