

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Learning Progress Reports

By Wednesday next week you will receive a notification that a new report has been published to the SchoolBytes Portal and app. *Student Learning Progress Reports* are an opportunity to consider the growth already made, the learning skills, habits and attitudes displayed, and chance to set goals together in partnership for the second half of the



year. It's crucial that even the youngest learners are a part of this process if they are to develop into *Agents of Learning* over their 7 years of primary school. To this aim, learners should have a chance to read and understand the report made on their progress. Teachers might begin this process in the classrooms before the end of the term, however your involvement at home over the coming holiday period is important – read and discuss the report together with your children individually!

Learning Progress Meetings

When we return from holidays, in Week 2 next term, we will be holding our usual start-of-Term 3 *Learning Progress Meetings*, with our Year 2 to Year 6 learners involved, telling us about their own reflections on their progress in class during Terms 1 and 2, and their learning goals and areas of focus for Semester Two. Kinder and Year One students are welcome to attend these meetings with the teacher and parents, however they are not required if you feel it more productive with just two adults in the room at this stage. An invitation to the online School Interviews booking system will be emailed out on the first day of Term 3, Tuesday 23rd July. Please get in early to book a time then that suits you.


Successful Learner Habit: Empathy and Persistence


During these past two weeks across the school we have been discussing and practising our empathy as a *Successful Learner Habit*.

Learning rarely happens in a solitary situation while at school. Showing awareness of, and sensitivity to, the feelings and learning needs of others (empathy) in our teams and groups is an important *Habit* to develop as it ensures:

- each learner has an open mind to the possibility that their own currently held ideas might be lacking or incorrect (a growth mindset) – awareness of their own values, judgments, opinions, and prejudices.
- learners value the knowledge, opinion, and skills of <u>all</u> group members and encourage their contribution, increasing the power of the group's collective wisdom and knowledge.
- learners are able to disagree politely and productively if necessary.
- the learner makes adjustments to their own behaviour to accommodate the needs of others in a group.

End of Term 2 Assembly

Next Wednesday, we will be holding our end of Term 2 assembly, starting at 12pm. We will be recognising our Cross Country and Athletics representatives, as well as our Ridgy Didge Buddies and Deadly Games winners. All are welcome to join us in celebrating a busy and exciting term of learning.

Semester 1 Reports

Our expert team of teachers have been diligently assessing, marking, collaborating and writing the Semester 1 reports for our students. These will be available for viewing next week; we will advise you when they are ready through the usual communication channels. We ask that you download and save a copy of your child's report locally, as they won't be available in the case of your child changing schools in the future. We also look forward to sharing your child's achievements and growth with you during next term's Learning Partnership Meetings, which will be held in Week 2 of Term 3. The booking link for these interviews will be sent out early next term.

School Development Day Term 3

The first day of Term 3 is a School Development Day, meaning it is a pupil-free day. Teachers will be engaged in professional learning on the English Syllabus in partnership with our colleagues at other local schools. Students will return to Ironbark on Tuesday, July 23rd.

Sports in Schools Australia (SiSA) Gymnastics Program Commencing: Monday 29th July (Term 3, Week 2)

All students in Early Stage 1 and Stage 1 will participate in a 40-minute gymnastics program run by professionally trained SiSA staff on Mondays throughout Term 3. This program assists in the development of coordination, flexibility, strength and power, which is not only of great benefit for gymnastics, but the skills gained also flow through to other sports. Parents and carers are reminded to provide consent and make payment for this activity through School Bytes by Friday, 26th July. Consent and payment through School Bytes will be available starting next week.

Public Education Week Open Day – Thursday, 8th August (Term 3, Week 3)

Public Education Week is an annual celebration of NSW public education and the achievements of our schools, teachers and students. This year's theme is 'Proud to belong'. The IRPS learning community is invited to our school to celebrate this theme on Thursday, August 8th. During Public Education Week, it is a time for all of us to feel "proud to belong" and share our pride in being part of our wonderful Ironbark Ridge learning community and NSW public education. We also celebrate and acknowledge all those who contribute to our students' educational journey during this week. Staff, parents and carers and our fantastic P&C all play an important role in our students' education. Further details will be provided closer to the event.

Teaching and Learning at Ironbark

When walking around the school, it is always lovely to see our students actively engaged in our wonderful teaching and learning programs at Ironbark Ridge. Over the past fortnight, students from 3W, 1W, 1D and 4R have enjoyed being creative and active with their specialist teachers during PE and creative arts lessons.









Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)

This fortnight's PBL focus is **SAFETY**: Collaborate when playing games. Over the next two weeks (Week 10, Term 2 and Week 1, Term 3), students will revise the following expectations during whole school meetings and in their classroom:

- 1. Discuss and agree on the rules of the game before playing.
- 2. Play fairly, following the rules that were agreed on.
- 3. Solve disagreements sensibly by talking calmly.
- 4. Ask a teacher for help if you need it.

Ridgy loves coming to school and challenging himself to learn in the classroom, but he also loves being with his friends in the playground. He knows that the best way to have fun and stay safe is to work with his friends to make sure that the game is a success.

Before starting a game, Ridgy and his friends talk about the rules that they will use when playing. They only start the game once they have agreed on the rules they will use and how they will play so that everyone has the same understanding.

Even though everyone agrees to follow the rules, sometimes Ridgy and his friends have disagreements. When they do, they try to solve the problem sensibly by calmly discussing the situation. If they can't solve the problem themselves, they know they can go to the teacher for help and the teacher will listen and help them find a solution. By doing these things, Ridgy and his friends help to make the playground a safe space for all Ironbarkers.

Upcoming events for Stage 2 include:

Week 10 --

Stage 2 Public Speaking Competition final round will be held on Tuesday 2nd July.

History Excursion to The Rocks

Stage 2 students will be attending an excursion to The Rocks in Sydney in Term 2 Week 10, as part of their history unit this year. During the excursion, students will put themselves in the shoes of the European people who first set foot on Australia's shores and discover why these explorers travelled such great distances. Students will learn about the effects of British colonisation in Australia and discuss indigenous perspectives on European arrivals. They'll examine the timeline of our country's journey through time, from Aboriginal inhabitation to post-colonial Australia. The excursion is sure to deepen student understanding and empathy for the struggles, challenges and triumphs that have made Sydney the great city it is today, including those of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples; early traders, explorers and settlers, first fleeters and their descendants. We are looking forward to all of Stage 2 gaining a new appreciation for the depth of experiences and perspectives that have made up our past.

Please note, students are to arrive at school by 8.30am for a prompt departure. They can wear either their sports or full school uniform. In a small bag, they are to bring their school hat and jacket, their recess, lunch and a water bottle. Students will not be able to purchase food and no canteen is available on the day.

Borrowing from our Library

Just a reminder that each week students can borrow books from the library. It is a wonderful opportunity for children to choose their own reading material. Please continue to encourage your child to borrow and return their library books each week. It is essential that students use a library bag to borrow books from the school library.
